# Police REVS Miles

The OIC Miles Police Station was honoured to be a part of the installation and unveiling of the Red Bench out the front of the Medical Centre on Marian Street on the 9th May 2023. The Red Bench is both a place for conversation, as well as a topic of conversation about Domestic Violence in all its shapes and forms that exist in our culture as Australians. As Australian citizens and members of the Miles community, we need to start the conversation about how to end domestic violence in our communities. We need to think globally and act locally for us to be successful at changing our culture where domestic violence is still largely accepted as people's private business. Whilst it could be argued that we as the greater community are becoming "bedroom police", the reality is that the impact of domestic violence is felt far beyond the doors of bedrooms; for example, domestic violence and women fleeing violent relationships, is the main cause for homelessness of children. Being homeless has a physical, economical and psychological impact on the children of parents who are involved in domestic violence behaviours. After all, how can you be expected to excel at school and sport and become a contributing member of any community if you don't have a safe place to sleep? If there has ever been an argument for the community to come together and say that enough is enough, this is it; the children of domestic violence relationships are our future. Emotionally and physically scarred children become adults to whom we will give over the reigns of our country. I, for one, want emotionally and psychologically healthy adults to run this beautiful country of ours. Let us work together to end domestic violence. Our success will be lived by the future leaders of our country. But we need to start at home, here in Miles. Never have police had to rely so much on community input to rid our homes of the scourge of domestic violence. Police cannot be successful in disrupting domestic violence, if we do not have the help of the public. Report DV by contacting Crime Stoppers or Policelink, or, best of all, by dropping into your local police station and tell police about your fears for yourself, your neighbours, your neighbourhood kids.

Property crime has, once again, been a hot topic, with young offenders being identified as the main cause of break and enters, stealing, and wilful damage in Miles and districts. Whilst police are doing what they can to hold the offenders accountable for their actions, police need to impress on the community that community safety and security is also your responsibility; look after yourself and look after your mates. Report suspicious behaviour. The more intel police can get, the better the chances of disrupting offenders and sending them to court where they can tell a magistrate why they believe it is fine for them to steal other people's property. on that note; there is a new method of gaining access to homes through locked security screen doors. The offenders utilise a "jet flame" lighter to melt the screen near the locking mechanism, so that they can poke a finger through and then unlock the screen door. Please ensure that you have a deterrent, like a Perspex shield, to protect the door lock. Lock the screen door with a key. In so doing you'll prevent the door from being opened by merely flicking the locking mechanism lever. Do whatever you can to make your house hard to break into. On that note, please lock your cars to prevent your property being stolen from inside your car. Cars are being stolen because people leave their keys in the ignition. Insurance companies do not pay out if you have left your keys in the car. take responsibility for your goods and chattel and look after your neighbours, so that we as a community can work together to disrupt criminal behaviour and deter criminals from offending.

Police have been approached about the parking arrangements in the main drag between Dawson St and Pine St. Police are supportive of disability parking being made available along that stretch of road. Drivers have asked police about how to enter and exit the parking bays. The answer is simple; drive forward into the parking, and then drive forward out of the parking. Please do not stop on the roadway and then reverse park into those parking bays in front of the Hotel Australia and the Newsagent/pharmacy and Community Centre, as well as in front of NFW and Miles Auto Parts. There will be a massive crash if people continue to attempt



reverse parking into the "new" parking bays. Drive in nose first, park, and drive out nose first. It really is that simple, and it does not require any traffic to stop just so that you can park in the "old way". Please speak to your local police if you have any queries about the "new" parking arrangements.

The Queensland Government has allocated \$81.6 million over the three years 2021-22 to 2023-24 to provide financial support to irrigators.

A 15 per cent discount has been applied to calculate prices for all irrigation customers supplied by Sunwater and Seqwater, with a further discount of 35 per cent to be made available for horticultural growers through the Horticulture Irrigation Pricing Rebate Scheme.

Rebates are available to customers who have been issued tax invoices (irrigation invoices) by Sunwater, Seqwater or Pioneer Valley Water Co-operative Limited in which some, or all of the prices have been calculated to include a discount of 15 per cent.

The rebate is available in relation to irrigation water charges for the three-year period 2021-22, 2022-23 and 2023-24.



# Origin Community Update

June 2023



Funded by Origin Energy as Upstream Operator of Australia Pacific LNG and conducted by the Regional Australia Institute, this study focused on the accessibility, availability, affordability and quality of childcare and the subsequent impacts on workforce participation, liveability, population attraction and retention in the Maranoa and Western Downs Local Government Areas in South-West Queensland.

Importantly, the purpose of this study was to collate evidence and share this back with the communities in which we operate, to facilitate further discussion and aid decision making between key community stakeholders. On Tuesday, 9th May 2023, Miles own Red Bench was unveiled by students of the Miles State High School, Councillor Kaye Maquire and Werner Crous OIC of the Miles Police Station.

The Red Bench Project was launched in 2019 by the Red Rose Foundation, encouraging the installation of red benches as permanent reminders that domestic violence occurs within our communities - but that we have the power to change the ending.

In 1916 the 25th day of April was officially named ANZAC Day, one year after Australian and New Zealand soldiers formed part of an allied expedition to capture the Gallipoli peninsula. On another cool autumn morning on the same day in 2023 at 5:45am many people gathered to pay their respects at the Dawn Service in ANZAC Park, Miles. It was the 108th anniversary of the Gallipoli landings.

Adrian Daveson led the veterans in the Dawn Service and acted as MC.

Slowly the sun rose and so did the spirit "They shall not grow old, as we that are left grow old; Age shall not weary them, nor the years condemn. At the going down of the sun and in the morning, we will remember them."

At 11am, the parade was held along the Murilla Street and ended at the ANZAC Park for this year's Commemoration Service.

The parade was again led by President of the Miles R.S.L. Sub Branch Adrian Daveson and other Army veterans, amongst others locals Eric Geldard OAM, Shirley Makin, Roger Wickham and Bob Gunning followed by Police, SES, Miles State School and High School, Murilla Long Daycare & Kindergarten, Murilla Kindy and Chinchilla Christian College.

Cr Kylie Bourne was the MC of the service at ANZAC Park and started by inviting 98 year old Eric Geldard to the rostrum. He received an honourable recognition of his 75 year R.S.L. Membership.

Warrant Officer I Darren Goldsmith from Oakey delivered the commemorative address and was happy to be here in Miles for ANZAC Day for the second year in a row. Student Leaders Thomas York and Harper Little from the Miles State High School read the listed names of all servicemen from the district who fell in WW I, WWII and Korea and fellow students Ivan Fuentes, Ciara Delphin and Rosie Courte read "the uniform resolution". MAID 2 Sing Choir sang

amongst other songs the national anthem during the service. "The Last Post" and the "Rouse" were played by Aderian Nixon with his bugles. Veteran Roger Wickham delivered a heartfelt speech which "challenges with honesty, passion and compassion" as Cr. Kylie Bourne said.

Each parade representative and others including QWCA, Murilla Respite, and Robyn Derksen honoured the fallen by laying down a wreath.

At 12:O5pm a fly past of a C-27J Spartan flown by Flight Lieutenant Brendan Lohman – Royal Australian Air Force 35 Squadron – C27 J Tactical Aircraft – Amberley impressed all spectators. The same aircraft flew over Wandoan just 10 minutes later.

The service ended with "Waltzing Matilda".

# Street Names of Tara - FRY ST

Have you ever wondered about the person behind a street sign's name? Tara Historical Society will take you on a little Tara street name tour. First up Fry Street.

Fry Street is named after Frank Fry, the first Chairman of the Tara Shire Council. Frank's father had been a farmer in Banwell, Somersetshire in England. He migrated to Australia in 1853 and in the same year married Sarah Poole in Gelong. Frank's birth register states that Sarah also came from Banwell. Frank was born in Learmouth about 10km north of Ballarat.

Frank Fry married Elizabeth Lyons on 10-10-1889. Their first child Blanche (Birdie Wilson) was born at Ballarat on 7-2-1891 and the second Myrtle (Neal) was born at Donald on 25-8-1892. So one presumes they moved to Donald in early 1892. Two more children, Franklin (24-8-1895) and Dorothy (Boag) (4-1-1900) were born at Narracan. Frank's wife Elizabeth died at Narracan on 5-1-01 when Dorothy was 1 year old. On 2-4-1902 Frank married Margaret Jane Kennedy. On 15-4-1903 twins Keith and Clarence universally known as Mick were born at Narracan. Another child Elsie was born on 14-6-04 at Narracan and on 14-8-05 Margaret (Madge Lindquist) was born at Gloucester. Their mother Margaret died twelve days later.

It appears the family had moved to Gloucester early in 1905. About the same year land in the Tara area was advertised in Victoria and it appears that a significant number of Melbournians were interested. D T Kennedy made a trip to Queensland to inspect the area. He was accompanied by Frank Edwards Fry, his son-in-law and E A Smith. We have no idea why or how they were chosen to do the inspection, but it was probably because they were farmers. They were able to travel by train as far as Jandowe 42 miles north of Tara. From there they used horses to travel through the bush, as there were no roads at that time.

On their return to Melbourne their report was apparently favourable as a number of Victorians bought land and settled in the district.

The Fry and Kennedy men arrived back in Tara in 1908 and settled on Undulla Creek. Frys on Laurendel and Kennedys on Dandaraga. The respective families arrived not long afterwards.

Life was hazardous in those days. After having buried two wives and one child, and moved to an untamed land, with three teenage children and three little children, Frank died suddenly six years later in 1914. But despite all this he had been active in community life.

Close friends, Angela Kibble & Scott York were chosen as Charlie`s Godparents. Father Tom Duncan officiated




the Mass and sacrament of Baptism which was spiritually uplifting and thoroughly enjoyed by all attending.





# Protect myGov

If your personal information is exposed in a data breach it can lead to identity theft and fraud. This can have serious consequences, including financial loss and emotional harm.

#### How to protect your myGov account

Your myGov account has security features that protect your information, but there are extra steps you can take to protect your account.

- Make sure your myGov password and PIN can't be easily guessed and are different to your other online accounts.
- 2. Choose a sign in option that makes it harder for scammers and fraudsters to access your account. Sign in options include:
- getting security codes sent to you by SMS
- getting security codes using the myGov Code Generator app
- signing in using your Digital Identity.

#### Suspicious activity on your account

If you think someone has accessed or tried to access your myGov account, check your myGov account history for suspicious activity.

If you're concerned after checking your account history, you should:

- Change your password.
- Go to your account settings to check your connected devices and disconnect any you don't recognise.
- Check your activity history within your linked services online accounts and contact that service if you see suspicious activity.

If you still have concerns about your myGov account, contact myGov helpdesk. Call 132 307 and select Option 1. The myGov helpdesk is open during local Australian time zones:

Monday to Friday, 7am to 10pm

Saturday to Sunday, 10am to 5pm.

Make sure you use a strong password that's easy for you to remember but hard for others to guess. Learn about creating strong passphrases on the Australian Cyber Security Centre website www.asd.gov.au/cyber-security



#### 110 YEARS OF MILES SHOW

On the 23 May 2023 the Annual Miles and District Show was held. The very original meeting for the Miles Show was held on 20 July 1912. At this meeting it was decided that a Show Society be formed and a subcommittee was to be formed to select a site for the Show and recreation purposes. The committee applied to the government to acquire 15 acres of land, formally known as Station Masters Paddock.

This application was successful and the Show Society was able to hold the first Show in 1913.



From its humble beginnings the Show has continued to be a great community event that celebrates agriculture, stock and local produce, as well as giving talented bakers, creatives and gardeners the opportunity to show off their expertise. Over the years the Show has had its ups and downs but has only been abandoned on several occasions due to the First and Second World Wars and significant weather events. # End of financial year 2022-23

Another financial year is coming to an end on 30th June 2023.

Before you prepare your tax return, find out what is new or has changed this income year. To find out more you can visit the website **www.ato.gov.au** or talk to your tax agent.

If you lodge your tax return online using myTax, you will need to link your myGov account to the ATO. Just keep in mind, if you're lodging your own tax return, you need to lodge it by 31st October 2023.

Some might have to find out if they need to lodge a tax return. Reasons why you may need to lodge a tax return include:

- had any tax taken out (withheld) from income you receive
- had \$1 or more of foreign income
- pay or receive child support
- had business or investment income
- are leaving Australia and have a study or training support loan.



# Super co-contribution

Have you heard of the super co-contribution? Eligible people can boost their retirement savings.

If you're a low or middle-income earner (your yearly before-tax income is less than \$57,016) and you make personal (after-tax) contributions to your super fund, the government may also make a contribution (called co-contribution).

The amount of government co-contribution you receive depends on your income and how much you contribute. Under the scheme the government matches 50 cents for every dollar you contribute to your super from your after-tax pay. The maximum amount of co-contribution is \$500.

You don't need to apply for the super co-contribution. When you lodge your tax return, we will work out if you're eligible. If the super fund has your tax file number (TFN) we will pay it to your super account automatically.

When you lodge your tax return, the ATO will determine the co-contribution amount you are entitled to and pay it directly to your superfund.



# Slow cooker Diane potatoes



Makes 6 servings | 15min prep | 6h cook

#### Ingredients

- 2 garlic cloves, crushed
- 2 tbsp Worcestershire sauce
- 1/4 cup tomato paste
- 2 tsp Dijon mustard
- 2 tbsp plain flour
- 1 tsp Massel Beef Stock Powder
- 125ml (1/2 cup) Bulla Cooking Cream
- 1kg desiree potatoes, thinly sliced
- 1 medium brown onion, halved, thinly sliced
- 200g swiss brown mushrooms, sliced
- 50g butter, cut into cubes
- Fresh flat-leaf parsley leaves, to serve
- Sour cream, to serve

#### Method

- Combine garlic, Worcestershire sauce, tomato paste, mustard, flour, stock powder and cream in a jug. Grease the bowl of a slow cooker with a little oil.
- Layer 1/3 of the potato, onion and mushroom in the slow cooker, drizzling with 1/3 of the cream mixture. Repeat to make another 2 layers. Dot over butter cubes.
- Cover and cook on HIGH for 6 hours. Sprinkle with parsley leaves and top with sour cream, to serve.

# Irish apple cake

Makes 10 servings | 20min prep | 70min cook

#### Ingredients

- 375g (21/2 cups) plain flour
- 150g butter, chilled, chopped
- 155g (3/4 cup) caster sugar, plus 55g (1/4 cup), extra
- 2 tsp baking powder
- 1/2 tsp ground cinnamon
- 4 (about 750g) Granny Smith apples, peeled, cored, coarsely chopped (about 2-3cm pieces)
- 2 eggs
- 60ml (1/4 cup) milk
- Vanilla custard or double cream, to serve

#### Method

- Preheat oven to 180C/160C fan forced. Invert base of a 22cm (base size) round springform pan. Grease the base with melted butter then line with baking paper. Secure the base back in pan, allowing paper to overhang the edge. Grease side of pan.
- 2. Place the flour and butter in a large bowl. Use your fingertips to rub the butter into the flour until the mixture resembles fine crumbs. Add the sugar, baking powder and cinnamon. Stir until well combined. Add the apple and stir until well combined. Whisk together the eggs and milk in a jug. Pour the egg mixture into the flour mixture and stir until well combined. Spoon the cake mixture into prepared pan. Use the back of a spoon to firmly press and spread mixture over base. Sprinkle the top with the extra sugar.
- Bake for 1 hour 10 minutes or until a skewer inserted into centre comes out clean. Set aside in the pan for 10 minutes to cool slightly. Transfer to serving plate and serve with custard or cream.
