## Learn to Love your Budget

Often, when someone first comes to talk to me about their financial position, I ask – "Do you do a budget?" – the first thing a lot of people say is "Groan – I don't have enough money to budget!" - - - which ironically is exactly the reason you need a budget, especially if you are on a limited income

A budget can be a single piece of paper in a notebook (although there are also a lot of fancy apps out there that will do the job too!). Or if you are running a business, you will need a cash flow summary. Something that will tell you really clearly, what's coming in & what's going out, so that when bills come in, you have money allocated to cover it.

When Financial Counsellors work with their clients, we often do a lot of Credit Repair. This is when somebody may have taken credit and now they are unable to repay it (there are a million reasons why this happens – including sickness, relationship breakdowns, disasters, loss of job, prison, scams, etc.). The reason we work through these issues with people is so that they arrive back to a state where they are able to live within their budget every week. The stress is removed (which cannot be underestimated) and barriers to getting credit from a mainstream lender may also be removed – meaning if you do need credit, you can get it at a decent interest rate instead of paying an astronomical rate through payday lenders and lenders of last resort.



Budgeting is the most important tool for financial management. It is an Action Plan that helps us to cope with expected and unexpected issues as they arise. It can help you track your spending patterns (i.e. The Cherry Ripe you buy every time you fill up your car with petrol - also known as a Spending Leak!). It also helps you to make better financial decisions – Do I Need it and Can I Afford it?? These 2 questions should be asked before every purchase. Is it in my budget? Maybe it will have to wait for a couple of weeks until I can afford it..... instead of putting it on my Afterpay account.

The desire to spend originates from many things – boredom; feeling restricted or thinking you need to reward yourself; it can be tied to mental health issues; it can be related to addictions; it may also be the patterns you were taught from your family. Just know that all of these contributing factors can be addressed, so that control over your money is regained.

## Rego Savings

### Information from https://www.qld.gov.au/transport/registration/fees/concession/senior

Did you know Queensland Government offers a reduction on your vehicle or boat registration?

You may be eligible, if you are:

- a Queensland resident
- a Queensland issued Seniors Card holder (not available to holders of a Seniors Business Discount Card)
- Pensioner Concession Card holder
- a prescribed services person (current or former member of the Australian Defence Force) and you have been assessed under the:
- Veterans Entitlement Act 1986 as having at least a 70% degree of incapacity or
- Military Rehabilitation Compensation Act 2004 as having at least 50 impairment points.

Your concession document and the registration of the vehicle or boat must be in the same name and must be used mainly for your own private use. Concessional registration only applies to the following vehicles recorded with a private purpose of use:

- motorcycles
- motor vehicle not over 4.5t GVM
- motorised caravan (no GVM limit)
- recreational boat.

You can only receive this concession for 1 vehicle and 1 recreational boat at a time. You will need to fill out a new form each time you wish to transfer this concession to a different vehicle or boat. You can only claim 1 concession per couple.

To apply, you need to complete a registration concession application (F3937) and show or provide a copy of one of the following:

- your Queensland Seniors Card
- your Pensioner Concession Card
- your Department of Veterans' Affairs (DVA) Veteran Gold Card embossed with TPI or FDA

You can send the completed form via email or post or **in person** by visiting your nearest transport and motoring customer service centre or, if you live in a rural area, a QGAP office, Magistrates Court or local police station.

### Family Tax Benefit Balancing Time

From early July we'll start balancing your Family Tax Benefit for the 2022-23 financial year. You don't need to do anything yet.



# Some emergency payments are taxable. If you got any, you will need to manually enter them in your tax return this year. servicesaustralia.gov.au/ paymentsummary

### Taxable emergency payments

If you got Pandemic Leave Disaster Payment, High-Risk Settings Pandemic Payment, Disaster Recovery Allowance Top-up or New Zealand

Disaster Recovery Allowance during the financial year, you'll need to manually include this in your tax return. These payments are taxable, but won't pre-fill in the Australian Taxation Office myTax, or show on your Centrelink payment summary.

You can check how much you got during the financial year by viewing the payment history or letters in your Centrelink online account through myGov, or letter we sent you in the post.

### **School Trip**

Throughout the year, ABSTUDY can also help you travel to other school events, like plays and sports matches.

This includes travel, accommodation and meal costs for a return trip between home and the event location.

### Age Pension and return to work

If you decide to return to work, you need to let Services Australia know. You may need to report your income regularly if you return to work, to avoid getting a debt.

The Queensland Farmers' Federation (QFF) and Queensland United Egg Producers (QUEP) are carefully considering the ministerial endorsement of a national update to the Australian Animal Welfare Standards and Guidelines for Poultry (S&G) following a recent joint meeting of the federal and all state agriculture ministers in Perth.

According to QFF, "the update to the guidelines has left cage egg producers very much in a state of uncertainty without providing a definitive date for the phasing out of conventional cage egg production," said QFF CEO Ms Sheppard. As part of the update to the S&G, conventional cage egg production will be phased out, with each state left to decide the timeframe for this transition. A previous draft of the S&G had set a deadline for an end to conventional cages by 2036, however this date is 10 years earlier than the 2046 deadline the egg industry had requested.

"Australian farmers lead the world when it comes to strong animal welfare practices, and this must be acknowledged. We need to be careful in finding a balance between responding to further enhancements to these practices and maintaining sustainable food production to ensure affordable and accessible food, and in this case protein, is available for everyone"

"Consumers across the country are already struggling with the cost-of-living crisis. Eggs remain one of the best, and most affordable, sources of protein, and a premature end to cage egg production will mean consumers will be paying more for their eggs at the checkout.

Queensland United Egg Producers CEO John Coward said "Variations in a phase out date for each state will impact how the standards and guidelines are practically implemented along with the associated legislation, which could lead to variances in how each state can meet supply demands impacting fair competition in the national market."

Mr Coward said despite this, the egg industry in Queensland is looking forward to working with the Queensland Government to establish clarity on the phase out of cage egg production in the state.

## Cost of Living rebate

The community is invited to do what Queenslanders do best, and support each other by spreading the word about the additional electricity rebate for vulnerable households. The 2023 State Budget included an additional \$700 electricity rebate for vulnerable households, on top of the existing \$372 concession. This brings the total rebate to \$1,072 for those eligible. All Queensland households will receive a \$550 rebate automatically applied to their electricity bill in quarterly instalments this financial year.

The Minister for Energy, Renewables and Hydrogen, Mick de Brenni said "Our Government set aside \$1.483 billion for extra electricity bill support in this budget, to help households and small businesses facing cost-of-living pressures.

- As many as 270,000 eligible Queenslanders could be missing out on \$1072 electricity bonus.
- Queensland seniors and concession card holders urged to check with their electricity provider.
- \$1,072 cost of living rebates available for eligible seniors, veterans and concession card holders.

### **IMPROVING PHYSICAL FUNCTION AND QUALITY OF LIFE**

### in Prep Celebration at Tara SSC



In the third edition of "Street Names of Tara" we look a bit closer at the person behind Bilton Street - JOE BILTON.

We only have limited information about Joe Bilton. He was amongst the earliest settlers in the Tara district and took up land on the corner of what is now the Surat Development Road and the Leichhardt Highway. Joe ran a dairy herd there. In 1913 the Huskisson family came to The Gums and they share farmed with him for about five years.

The cream was taken to Tara twice a week by dray then railed to Dalby. Mr Bilton built a house on "Antrim". The timber for the house was milled using a "pit-saw". A pit-saw was similar to a cross cut saw but was used vertically, one operator stood above the log and pulled the saw up the other worked under pulling the saw down on its cutting stroke.


Mr Bilton had a housekeeper called Miss Ferguson (she originated from Antrim in Ireland.) Miss Ferguson had a ward named Morris, who eventually inherited the property.

Mr Bilton lived on the property until his death in 1948. Miss Hessie Ann Ferguson lived on the farm until she passed away in 1962 aged 75. She never came to The Gums Church just over the road, but in her later years liked to sit on her veranda and listen to the people singing in the church.


Showgirl Winner was Rebekah Miller from St. George and Sophie Kelly from Charleville won Runner Up.







Colours of the Spirit by Gorja Cookson

A low buzz filled the air as we moved closer to the sound. The bass notes resonated deep in my bones, and a throaty voice accompanied it along with the crashing of sticks. I crouched lower behind the bush, Nellie hiding next to me. She stifled her torchlight under her shirt, a beacon for our location. The blaze in front of us burned bright enough to light up the world. Its flames rose, smoke dancing around it and billowing out to create shapes and animals against the night sky. We had followed the smoke for ages, tracing it from the fence line on Nellie's farm which backed onto the expanse of dry bushland and native gums, to the sight standing before us. Six people covered in paint had intricate, dotted designs along their arms and shoulders. They started to dance as another low bass hum joined the first, and genteel conversations started in a language foreign to me. But the dancing wasn't. It was a lot of foot stamping and using your arms and clapping rhythms into the earth. It was a celebration – a show of respect to the elders of the clan.

"Nellie!" I whispered as quietly as I moved to where she now stood. "Why is Alinta here? I didn't know her family was First Nations."

"She takes part in these ceremonies all the time. These dances are sacred to their culture. Her family taught her as soon as she could walk. Look!" Nellie's eyes were shining as we took in the array of red, black, white and yellow. As I watched where she pointed, Alinta was kneeling next to an elder man, smearing what looked like paint across his torso and arms. Nellie tilted her head in confusion, as he dipped his fingers in the white once more and drew it to his cheeks before repeating the action on Alinta. The stripes contrasted against their dark skin and the red cloth of the tie around his arms. I marveled at the sight of him; the image was something I had never seen before. That's when Alinta spotted us.

Alinta was subtle with her movements as she made her way around the clearing. Nellie and I moved so she could sit in front of us. If anyone looked, all they would see was Alinta sitting next to the bush.

"Who are they? The ones next to the feather lady?" Nellie asked.

"They are the elders. They teach the ceremonies to my parents, and uncles and aunties. Then they teach the children. It's a tradition that's been alive before I was born, before they were born. They say we can't let it die. Our spirit. Or we too will die along with it."

We all looked with curiosity at the others who had joined the dance, and the elders Alinta has pointed out. It looked so traditional, the streaks of white across their skin illuminated in the glow of the firelight. This ceremony, this tribute, it couldn't be a secret... the sounds of their song were growing louder and louder by the second. Another wood instrument had joined in, and kids who looked about our age came slinking out of the bushes behind us. They didn't seem to mind that we were outsiders. Two brushed past me, laughing as they sat at the edge of the makeshift circle. We drowned in the cacophony of voices and birds nearby.

"What if they see us watching?" We moved to the edge of the clearing; our faces highlighted in the heart of the fire. If anyone noticed us intruding, they didn't call out and my confidence grew enough that I pulled Nellie out from behind the bush. One of the elders spotted us then, through the smoke blowing wildly in the wind. I held her gaze as she raised her painted hand in a wave. Bowing my head, I took a step forward dragging Nellie with me. As we stilled, she nodded, pointing towards the children now joining the dance. Nellie answered with the most resounding thing I'd heard in my whole life.

"I think they need to be seen.

We are all well aware of the fires which began around 12th February 2023 and lasted many weeks in the areas of Miles - Myall Park, Kowguran, Hookswood, Gurulmundi, and more; Fairylands, Tara/Montrose, and Weir River. Recovery efforts continue and multiple organizsations have assisted those affected, including Community Centres, Neighbourhood Centres, St. Vincent de Paul, Western Downs Regional Council, Lifeline, Community Recovery and Blaze Aid to name just a few. We refer to one another and explore options to suit individual situations.

Rural Aid has supplied pre-paid visas and hay to primary producers, as well as water tanks and water.

Rural Aid and Blaze Aid have had an amazing partnership working on helping folks affected by these recent fires. Approx 35km of fencing was repaired or replaced while their camp was in Miles. # Easy Lamb Flatbread



Makes 4 servings | 10min prep | 20min cook

#### Ingredients

- 1 large red onion
- 11/2 tbsp extra virgin olive oil
- 1 long fresh red chilli, thinly sliced
- 1 tbsp ground cumin, plus extra, to sprinkle
- 500g lamb mince
- 1 tbsp tomato paste
- 1 lemon, rind finely grated
- 400g garlic Afghan bread
- 90g (1/3 cup) Greek-style yoghurt
- 100g soft feta, coarsely crumbled
- 1/2 cup combined fresh herbs (mint and coriander leaves)

#### Method

- Preheat oven to 23OC/21OC fan forced. Thinly slice half the onion into rings and reserve. Finely chop remaining onion.
- Heat 1 tablespoon of oil in a large non-stick frying pan over medium-high heat. Add chilli and chopped onion. Cook, stirring, for 2 minutes or until softened. Stir in the cumin for 30 seconds or until aromatic. Increase heat to high. Add the mince. Cook, breaking up lumps with a wooden spoon, for 4 minutes or until browned. Stir in the tomato paste for 1 minute. Stir in lemon rind and season.
- Place bread on a large baking tray. Top with lamb mixture. Dollop with yoghurt and top with feta. Sprinkle with extra cumin. Bake for 15 minutes or until golden and crisp.
- Meanwhile, juice half the lemon. Cut remaining lemon into wedges. Combine the reserved onion, lemon juice and remaining oil in a bowl. Season. Set aside to macerate. Add herbs. Toss to combine.
- 5. Top the pizza with the onion mixture. Serve with lemon wedges on the side.

# No-bake Blueberries & Honey Cheesecake Tart

Makes 10 servings | 2h 55min prep |

#### Ingredients

- 250g Arnott's Granita biscuits
- 90g butter, melted
- 2 tbsp boiling water
- 2 tsp gelatine powder
- 250g cream cheese, softened
- 1/3 cup (115g) honey
- 1tsp lemon juice
- 1 tsp vanilla extract
- 1/4 cup (125ml) thickened cream
- 250g blueberries
- 1/4 cup (90g) honey, extra
- 1/4 cup (35g) shelled pistachios, chopped

#### Method

- Process biscuits in a food processor to form crumbs. Add butter and process until combined. Press biscuit mixture over base and side of a 2cmdeep, 23cm round loose-bottomed tart pan. Chill for 30 mins.
- Meanwhile, place 2 tablespoons of boiling water in a small bowl. Sprinkle over gelatine and whisk with a fork until completely dissolved. Cool for 5 mins.
- 3. Use an electric mixer to beat cream cheese, honey, lemon juice and vanilla in a bowl for 5 mins or until light and fluffy. Add cream and beat for 2 mins or until mixture thickens slightly. With motor running, gradually add gelatine mixture. Stir in half the blueberries. Pour mixture into biscuit base. Chill for 2 hours or until set.
- Remove cheesecake from pan. Top with remaining blueberries. Drizzle with extra honey and sprinkle with pistachios.
