

Emerge Youth Founder Jen Shaw attended the ball with one of the young people that she has taken under her wing. 14-year-old Chelsea shared her story, while Jen explained the purpose and goals of Emerge. How fitting is their organisation name? Every day Jen and her other youth worker "work with the most vulnerable young people in the Toowoomba community – kids that are left behind, fallen through the cracks, forgotten.

A tough cohort of kids that are both resilient and brilliant. We look for the gold, we give chances, and we do whatever it takes to help them become their best self, reach their true potential, and chase their dreams."

Many local businesses supported this charity event. On the night, \$15,400 was raised during the live auction. Many supported the silent auction and the "diamond raffle" of a shiny 3.53 ct Ceylon Sapphire, kindly donated by Hogan Family Jewellery from Toowoomba. According to the committee the event raised over \$20,000. As the Tanzanian proverb says "Little by little, a little becomes a lot". Taroom Black Tie Ball committee would like to thank to all generous local sponsors and those who donated auction items.

After the auction the dancing began, with live music provided by the Riley Young Band and the celebrations continued well into the night.



This year the Club was able to put on a Lady's Bar to celebrate the Ladies at our Club who volunteer and support



## LAO - Free Service

### Article supplied by Land Access Ombudsman

"I am concerned that the resource company isn't washing down their equipment correctly every time they access my land."

Caught in a land access issue with a resource company and in need of help? There is no need to feel alone – Queensland has a FREE service that supports landholders to help solve these kinds of disputes.

Approximately 96% of Queensland's Coal Seam Gas (CSG) wells can be found in the Bowen and Surat Basins.

What does that mean for the community of the Miles and Western Downs region?

It means that at some point in time you may enter into a Conduct and Compensation Agreement (CCA) or Make Good Agreement (MGA) with a resource company who wants to access your land for resource production – possibly CSG activities

While most of the time resource companies and Queensland's landholders maintain positive working relationships, sometimes problems occur, and it can be difficult to solve an issue alone.

Common issues experienced by landholders include Biosecurity and washdown concerns, damage to property or equipment and impacts to neighbouring property.

The Land Access Ombudsman (LAO) provides a FREE service to Queenslanders to help with land access disputes. This means that landholders can access FREE independent advice and support to help resolve a dispute or ask questions about a land access issue or matter.

Land Access Ombudsman Jane Pires is committed to making sure that the people of the Western Downs and Miles region get the help they need and encourages anyone who isn't sure about a matter to reach out to the team to talk about their situation.

It is as simple as asking a question to get the support process started. The dispute resolution team can then look at the problems at hand and do their best to start solving your issues.

You can email a question or query through to the team on enquries@lao.org.au or call the team for FREE on 1800 171 550. If the LAO can't help with your immediate issues they will connect people with the right help that they need.

## Child Care Subsidy balancing starts mid-August

Services Australia can balance your Child Care Subsidy (CCS) once you and your partner confirm your income. You can do this by lodging a tax return, or by telling us you don't need to.

When we have all the information we need, we can balance your CCS and let you know the outcome. This may take up to 28 days after you get your tax notice of assessment.

If you told us you don't need to lodge a tax return for Family Tax Benefit (FTB), you still need to tell us for CCS. This is because we balance them separately.

You also need to do this if we balanced your FTB without you needing to do anything.

## Changes to independence criteria for ABSTUDY customers

You'll be independent for ABSTUDY if you're currently, or have ever been, in a de facto relationship for at least 6 months.

From July 2023, Services Australia stopped assessing de facto relationships under the reviewable criteria for independence. This means that we'll consider you as permanently independent for ABSTUDY even if your relationship ends. This includes if you separate, or your partner passes away.

If you're 22 or older Services Australia will treat you as permanently independent, also in certain circumstances:

- 22 or older
- independent through work.
- 15 or older and an orphan.
- 15 or older and have special adult status in a traditional community.
- have or had a dependent child.
- have spent a total of 6 months or more in lawful custody.
- are, or were, married under Australian law or Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander Australian lore.
- are currently, or have ever been, in a de facto relationship of at least 6 months or a registered relationship.

## Government Services—closer than you think - Miles, Chinchilla & Tara

Services Australia can help you with Centrelink, Medicare and other government programs and services. We're all Agents of Services Australia. Using our computers, you can log into your myGov account and do your business on the spot. If you don't have a myGov account, we'll help you to set one up.

You can access the phone self service or speak to a Services Australia Service Officer. If you'd rather use your mobile phone or tablet, we've got free Wi-Fi available 24/7. You don't need a password so you can get online straight away. You can also use the Wi-Fi to download and install the Express Plus mobile apps. We can help you set up your digital services if you're not sure what to do. You can also lodge forms, get your identity documents confirmed and pick up brochures. Your local Agents are:

## HELLINSPECTIONS Carcase Comp

Between July to September (These dates may change at late notice, subject to weather conditions.) Powerlink will be conducting helicopter inspections of their transmission lines. Landowners who have a Powerlink easement on or near their property who are interested in receiving information about future inspections in their area can register their details by contacting Powerlink on 1800 635 369. Find more details of upcoming inspections on <a href="https://www.powerlink.com.au/helicopter-activities">https://www.powerlink.com.au/helicopter-activities</a>

During our inspections, you may notice a helicopter flying at a low level near our transmission lines. The helicopter pilot will endeavour to maintain the maximum distance practically possible from houses, livestock and crops to minimise any disruptions to landholders. Insulator washing work will involve the helicopter pausing at transmission towers and using a long, rigid hose to spray demineralised water at high pressure to clean the insulators which are located near the top of the towers.

Beef producers from around Australia have a unique opportunity to benchmark their product on a national level by entering Beef Australia's 2024 AMPC National Beef Carcase Competition – with participating processors in every state, this is truly a national event.

The appraisal system utilised in the competition is specifically designed to meet both export and domestic market requirements and uses the latest technology available to the beef industry.

The AMPC National Beef Carcase Competition aims to give feedback to producers about compliance of beef carcases to market specifications, lean meat yield, and predicted eating quality of those carcases (MSA index).

A new class has been introduced into the 2024 competition, allowing for weights of 360 kilograms or over into a new Open Class unrestricted feeding section. This will allow for producers who target long-fed markets to nominate into the new class, allowing for a bigger and better competition in 2024.

In recognition of the hard work each participating plant contributes to the success of the Beef Australia AMPC National Beef Carcase Competition, a new award category has been introduced. The 'Most Successful Plant' award will be awarded to the processing plant that achieves the highest score.

The young offender was arrested and conveyed to the Toowoomba Watchhouse where his bail was formally objected to. He was charged with a number of offences. The magistrate then dealt with him on the next available court date and made a decision regarding the young offender's future. Police would like the community to know that they have done all they could in order to hold the offender accountable for his actions. Police have no say in the decisions made by the courts, irrespective and regardless of the nature of the offender's crimes. The officer in charge of Miles Police Station is content with the way local police have conducted investigations into youth offending in the Miles Police Division. Miles police officers have an excellent record for successful prosecutions of young offenders.

The previous month has brought Miles police officers a very high number of calls for service regarding domestic violence matters. This has had a significant impact on officer availability for other policing matters. Whilst the rising number of DV matters is concerning, Miles Police maintain their professionalism and dedication to all policing matters, regardless of time constraints. Your local police are available to answer any questions or concerns that you may have for all matters, including domestic violence issues.






## **Basic Rights QLD**

In this edition of the Community News, we wanted to take a moment to highlight the incredible work being done by Basic Rights Queensland (BRQ). For over 35 years, this community legal centre, consisting of teams of social workers, solicitors, and industrial advocates, has been providing vital, free legal advice regarding Centrelink issues, Disability Discrimination and Women's rights in the workplace.

Over the past 3 years BRQ workers have been travelling extensively to rural and remote towns of Queensland bringing advice and support to those communities. They have been training staff in community organisations to develop the capacity to identify and address Centrelink issues, Disability Discrimination and Women's rights in the workplace and to refer appropriately when required.


In March 2023, BRQ's Working Women Queensland (WWQ) program partnered with Chinchilla Community Centre to offer legal advice and information in Chinchilla and in Dalby, collaborating with Goondir Health Services and Women's Legal Service Qld. The WWQ team offers a statewide service via telephone and online. In certain cases, they also provide representation at a tribunal or court.

In relation to the support that BRQ can give to community organisations, Jill McKay, the Director of the WWQ team said: "We would be pleased to share information, support and legal advice to workers and employers about the changes to workplace laws, including in relation to sexual harassment."

BRQ's Social Security team offers telephone advice on Centrelink matters and provides advocacy and representation at the Administrative Appeals Tribunal. This is a critical resource for anyone struggling with social security issues.

In exciting news, BRQ recently received significant additional funding to establish a state-wide Mental Health Legal Hub. "This expansion will help us better understand what our clients need and enable us to provide targeted advice and referral pathways" says Sam Tracy, the Practice Director at BRQ.

Mr Tracy went on to say: "If any members of the public would like free legal advice on Centrelink issues, Disability Discrimination and Women's rights in the workplace call BRQ on 1800 358 511. If your workplace would like training and support around these issues, please email brg@brq.org.au."



## Murilla Garden Groups TIPS & TRICKS

## September

Thank you to Mary Morgan of 'Myall Grove' for rising to the occasion of showing off her garden in the middle of winter. This allowed the MGG to have our meeting, but more importantly, our catch up with friends.

A dense growth of Brigalow and Belah trees mark the beginning of our experience. Mary tells me that this was deliberately left by her late husband, Goff, to show what the land was like before it was cleared. This then gives way to a beautiful open expanse, punctuated by a variety of well-established trees and gardens, all linked by an extensive, well-manicured lawn.

Mary has many potted plants, with petunia's being the mainstay. These have the ulterior motive of being used at their upcoming Shorthorn Sale in September to add some colour. She dead heads these throughout July and August to ensure they are in full glory for the occasion.

A Moreton Bay Fig captures the eye; not only for its size (despite having been recently pruned back), but also because of the way the root system has developed around the edges of the pavers – seemingly creating their own artistic masterpiece.

A Cat's Claw is spotted - Mary classes it as a pest - but it adds a point of interest, particularly over the archway where it grows enthusiastically. Pink salvias, geraniums, roses, iris', red canias, bougainvillea and lagerstroemia also feature throughout. Beautiful red and yellow hibiscus are scattered, adding a vibrant colour to her garden. Pampas grass and white may bushes are also sighted. Mary points out a Quisqualis, with a pink flower, which is her favourite plant in her garden - it originates from a cutting which came from her childhood home.

A palm tree grove is followed by beautiful, well-established Racehorse trees, Jacarandas, Trelianas, Silky Oaks, Chinchilla Gum, Grevilleas, Cherry Blossom and a Pine tree, planted in 1960. An idyllic retreat is found underneath a robust Drunken Parrot tree with a table and chairs set up for a spot of relaxation. As we wander, Mary points out a majestic Bottle tree and tells me that it was given to her and Goff on their engagement in 1964!

Various stalls added to the day with their homemade produce for sale - Simon and Gail Kutasi brought along their apple cider vinegar, soaps and honey; Sonja's Farmhouse had plants and her famous chutneys and jams while Payton's Pantry had her delectable biscuits, slices and cakes to keep the crowd happy!

Mary, how blessed you are to have such a garden to meander through, with so many special memories literally grown through the years. Thank you once again for inviting us in!







Blue EDGE has been running in Chinchilla since 2019, a program run by Queensland Blue Light and eagerly taken up by Senior Constable Vincent Bradley from Chinchilla Police and Police Liaison Officer Robyn Jennings.

EDGE stands for Educate, Develop, Grow and Empower. The program uses physical training as a tool to help young people develop discipline, learn goal setting skills, and grow through the achievement of personal goals.



Students selected for the program are the ones who Blue Light Staff feel will gain the most from participating in the program. CSHS teachers Mrs Mead and Ms Leerentveld are also involved in the vetting process, their expertise in working with the students and their rapport with the students has been invaluable since the program has started.

During this last EDGE program students got the opportunity to participate in Soccer, Jujitsu, Boxing, Crossfit, Dancing and assembling Solar Buddy's for students in the Highlands of Papua New Guinea who do not have access to a reliable power supply.

Guest Speakers are also an integral part of the program. We are lucky enough to have so many people in our community willing to give up their time to speak to the students. Some of the guest speakers during this EDGE were from afar, such as Monique Murphy who is a Paralympic swimmer. Monique represented Australia at the 2016 Rio Paralympics where she won a silver medal. Her talk with the students was impressive and enlightening; Monique spoke about her challenges and how she overcame them.

Local guest speakers included QFES Chinchilla, Councillor Peter Saxelby, Jake Lamont, current CSHS school captain Skyla Llewellyn, Paul Grima (Lives Lived Well) and various others.

The program has been well received in the community, with many organisations wanting to donate services or goods to see the program continue. We could not have continued the program without the constant support of the following organisations & businesses in Chinchilla: Drought Angels, Origin, Chinchilla Newsagency, BASE Chinchilla, BnG Coaches, Chinchilla State High School.



# Tara's Street Names - Adams St

In 1859 James Adams and his wife emigrated to Australia from Maybole about 9 miles south of Ayr in Scotland. They travelled in the sailing ship "The Admiral Boxer" to Melbourne then headed for the gold fields settling at Golden Square near Bendigo. They had a family that included Andrew Watt Adams who was born in 1874. A W married Bella in 1897. In 1908 they joined the Schutt, Lester and Bogle families to come to the, recently opened for settlement, land at Tara. Traveling by the "Yongala" to Brisbane then by train to Warra from there it was horse and buggy for Andy, Bella and their six children to travel to "Sunnyside" at Perthton, where they set up home.



In addition to dairying and grazing they had bees but timber was a more important side of the enterprise. In conjunction with the Harwoods they milled hardwood and then when the government sleeper mill was set up in Tara also supplied it with logs.

A W soon became involved with civic matters. He was a foundation member of the Progress Association and the Tara Pastoral and Agricultural Society. He was instrumental in the establishment of the Bush Nursing Centre, later the Hospital, practically every other public body in TARA. He was elected to the Shire Council in 1916 subsequently serving as Shire Chairman for several terms. He passed on in 1948.

Although the Adams name is now not common in our community, his legacy is carried on by the many descendants of his daughters. There is a memorial plaque in the Tara Hospital commemorating

the civic service given by his granddaughter Gwen.


These appointments can include X-rays or other tests, specialists appointments and/or hospital appointments. One bus is equipped with a wheelchair lifter.

# One-pot melting lemon salmon spaghetti



Makes 4 servings | 5min prep | 15min cook

### Ingredients

- 1 lemon
- 350g dried spaghetti pasta
- 250g carton mascarpone
- 150g baby spinach
- 150g smoked salmon slices, torn into large pieces

### Method

- Use a peeler to cut wide strips of rind off the lemon then thinly slice lengthways into long thin strips. Juice the lemon.
- Pour juice and 1.25L (5 cups) water into a large saucepan. Cover. Bring to the boil over medium-high heat. Add pasta, stirring constantly, until water comes back to the boil.
- Reduce heat to medium. Cook, stirring every 2-3
  minutes, for 12 minutes or until the pasta almost
  al dente. Add mascarpone and spinach. Cook,
  stirring, for 2 minutes or until the pasta is al dente
  and the mascarpone is melted. Remove from
  heat. Set aside for 2 minutes or until sauce thickens slightly.
- 4. Stir in rind and salmon. Season and serve.



# 3-ingredient lemon ricotta tray cake

Makes 4 servings | 10min prep | 15m cook

### Ingredients

- 375g bottle pancake shake mix
- 160g (1/2 cup) lemon curd
- 120g (1/2 cup) smooth ricotta (from a tub)

### Method

- Preheat oven to 190C/170C fan forced. Place one shelf in the centre of the oven. Grease a 2.5cmdeep, 23 x 28cm (base measurement) baking tray.
- Prepare the pancake mix following packet directions. Pour into the prepared tray. Spoon lemon curd over the pancake mixture. Add 1-2 tablespoons of water to the ricotta and stir to loosen. Spoon over lemon curd. Use a knife or skewer to gently swirl the lemon curd and ricotta.
- 3. Bake on the middle shelf for 20 minutes or until set. Remove from oven.
- 4. Heat oven grill on high. Grill for 1-2 minutes or until the top is golden. Serve immediately.


