Western Downs' 10 Artists - Third Artist introduction

This month, the Community Newsletter features Western Downs 10 Artists participant Christopher Rigg.

Growing up on the coast and born into a sailor's dynasty, Christopher was always drawn to the ocean and to the NAVY but also to art. Christopher can remember his first artwork at 12 years old. An Australian flag coloured in as a wave with a surfer riding the wave and written below "Made in China". A strong message for a young age.

Christopher's greatest inspiration is nature, especially the ocean. Anything he sees, he sketches then and there in a pocket notebook, which he always carries with him. Later Christopher uses his "doodles" to draw with pen and pencils or creates timber carvings.

First Nation Art, sculptures and carvings is much admired by Christopher. He can remember his dad returning from a Navy trip from New Zealand in the 60's and bringing home a few pieces of wood carvings. Christopher has always been surrounded by the mediums he continues to use to this day.

Christopher took to the art world straight out of high school, leaving in year 10 to attend the Newcastle Arts School before joining the Navy.





Following his service he made his way back to art, using his time at sea to find inspiration and explore a unique perspective. Often naming his pieces early on in the creative process, he likes to use words to convey the deeper meanings behind each of his pieces.

In 2011, Christopher Rigg moved, after 21 years of Navy, to Chinchilla for a job. With the help of his Boiler & Turbine Operator tickets he acquired a job at Kogan Power Station.

Christopher enjoys living in our district and he is grateful for being part of the Western Downs' 10 Artists 2023 project. Christopher is impressed with the support local artists receive from the community and Western Downs Regional Council.



A dream come true...

In Mid-August 2023 in Chinchilla, Polocrosse Australia President Mick Templeton announced the Polocrosse World Cup Team who will represent Australia. Miles local Lindsey Doolan is one of the eight selected players.

Growing up on the family farm at Coffs Harbour, NSW, Lindsey followed the passion of her parents – playing polocrosse and starting at the age of 6 years.

Polocrosse always had a high priority for Lindsey. She was able to continue to play at boarding school. Thanks to a scholarship, Lindsey attended New England Girls School (NEGS). NEGS has a world-class equestrian facility which is considered one of the best in Australia and has a long history of its students representing Australia in the Olympics. (https://negs.nsw.edu.au/equestrian/)

In 2017, Lindsey moved to Miles to be with her partner Aaron Mullins. She has worked at the local Condabri Beef feedlot since 2019. Since her move to the district, Lindsey represents Chinchilla Polocrosse Club and even with her busy worklife, she still has the eyes on the prize. She trains her horses daily after work and three days a week she will work out or go for a morning run to keep herself fit.



To qualify for the World Cup Australian team Lindsey had to firstly compete in the New Zealand Test Series in March 2023, followed by Warwick Test Series in May 2023. In Warwick the Australian team played against the "Rest of the World" team.

Now Australia will be represented by 4 ladies and 4 gentlemen (five players are from Queensland) amongst them our local girl Lindsey, at the 2024 Polocrosse World Cup in South Africa.

It won't be the first time that Lindsey has played polocrosse in South Africa. She has already been there three times; the last time only a few

months ago, where she played "High Goal" in Durban. This is where the World Cup will be held.

Lindsey explained that one difference between Australia and South Africa in playing polocrosse are the horses. In comparison to Australia, South Africa's polocrosse horses are more Thoroughbred. Another difference is that, the international polocrosse rules allow you to throw an overarm goal. This is a no-go in the Australian ruling. This doesn't worry Lindsey; her calm response is "You just have to play a different game."

The Polocrosse World Cup will be held over 2 weekends in July 2024 in Durban, South Africa. Eight countries will be represented: Australia, New Zealand, South Africa, Zimbabwe, Zambia, UK, Ireland and USA.

Lindsey has always dreamed of being part of the Polocrosse World Cup team and to represent Australia. Now she has achieved that, her next goal is to win the Polocrosse World Cup. So far, Australia has not won the Polocrosse World Cup outside of Australia.

Background Info: Polocrosse was developed in Australia in 1938 by Mr and Mrs Edward Hirst of Sydney. It was inspired by an indoor exercise they'd seen in England which used old polo sticks with squash racquet heads and a shallow string net to replace the mallet on the end of the stick. Polocrosse is a combination of polo, lacrosse and netball. The game quickly spread, and today there are over 250 clubs throughout Australia. The game is now played in New Zealand, South Africa, Zimbabwe, USA, Canada, England, Ireland, France, The Netherlands, Uruguay, Vanuatu, Denmark, Finland, Mexico and Argentina.

Energy Bill Relief

Source: Queensland Treasury Last updated: 13 June 2023

The 2023–24 Budget delivers \$1.483 billion for additional electricity bill support to households and small businesses facing cost-of-living pressures. This is the most significant electricity bill support package announced by any state or territory, more than doubling the size of the Federally agreed support package for Queensland under the National Energy Bill Relief Fund.

- \$550 Cost of Living Rebate on electricity bills to all Queensland households
- \$700 Cost of Living Rebate on electricity bills for vulnerable households, in addition to the existing \$372 under the Queensland Electricity Rebate Scheme, bringing total rebates for this group to \$1,072
- \$650 rebate on electricity bills for around 205,000 eligible small businesses, cutting the cost of doing business in Queensland

As part of this package, all Queensland households will automatically receive a \$550 Cost of Living Rebate on their electricity bill in 2023–24, while around 600,000 vulnerable households will benefit from a higher \$700 Cost of Living Rebate. In addition, vulnerable households will continue to receive a \$372 rebate under the Queensland Electricity Rebate Scheme, bringing total support for this group to \$1,072 in 2023–24.


The Government's substantial cost-of-living relief package will more than offset typical household electricity bill increases in 2023–24. In some cases, households will have zero bills or be in credit in 2023–24. Including the \$550 Cost of Living Rebate in 2023–24, the government will have provided all Queensland households with a total of \$1,125 in electricity rebates since 2018. Eligible small businesses in Queensland will also receive an automatic rebate of \$650 on their electricity bill in 2023–24. This includes around 205,000 Queensland small businesses that consume less than 100,000 kilowatt hours per annum.

The Queensland Government's cost-of-living relief package significantly increases and broadens support under the National Energy Bill Relief Plan, jointly funded by the Queensland and Australian Governments.

As part of this package, the Queensland Government has also allocated \$60 million for a Household Energy

Initiatives program, and \$10 million for Vulnerable Households Energy Advice Initiatives to deliver energy efficiency measures to keep costs down for households, enabling more choice and greater energy equity. This constitutes Queensland's co-contribution to the Australian Government's Household Energy Upgrades Fund.







Spring is here and to herald its arrival the wattles bloom. The Garden has many varieties of wattles (known as Acacias), some of them quite rare.

These plants all have yellow flowers, usually a ball or oblong of bright yellow made up of many fine tendrils. These plants are legumes, grow quickly and often have quite short life spans but add nitrogen to the soil which benefits other plants. They are known as pioneer species.

Medical evidence

You need to give Centrelink medical evidence if you claim Disability Support Pension (DSP), or have a medical review.

Centrelink needs to know how your disability or medical condition affects you. This will help to work out if you can get DSP.

Medical evidence from your treating doctors or other health professionals is needed with current evidence for each condition that affects your ability to work.

Give all your medical evidence with your claim so Centrelink can assess it faster. It should support what you've put in the medical details section of your claim form.

If you don't give us evidence, we may either:

- reject your claim
- stop your payment.

If you're having problems getting evidence, phone or visit your closest Community Centre. We can talk with you about your options.

What Centrelink needs to know

Your medical evidence should tell any of the following:

• your diagnosed disability or medical conditions

- past, current and planned treatment
- how your condition impacts you day to day
- the names and contact details of your treating doctors.

Your symptoms any of the following:

- when the symptoms started
- how often and for how long the symptoms happen
- the impact of your conditions with treatment and use of aids, equipment or assistive technology.

Your prognosis, how long your condition will last and if it:

- will improve, stay the same, or get worse
- may affect how long you'll live.

What types of medical evidence you need to give

The evidence we need depends on your disability or medical condition. For some conditions or situations we need particular information.

The Queensland Rural and Industry Development Authority (QRIDA) is a specialist provider of government financial assistance programs, including loans, grants and rebates.



At the time of writing this report the Miles Community had taken a breather after the excitement of the 2023 Back to the Bush Festival. The event was very well organised and, by all reports, was an enjoyable affair. Police wish to thank all attendees and visitors from far and wide for their excellent behaviour throughout the event. The BTTB Festival is something Miles can be proud of, and will leave a lasting impression upon visitors that Miles is a great place to live.

Since the last edition of the Newsletter a number of cars had been stolen and taken on joyrides through town, as well as the old Police Paddock at the end of Pine Street in Miles. Every single car that was stolen was unlocked and had the keys in the ignition or tucked away in the car somewhere to hide it when the miscreants stole the cars. Whilst it is true that we should be able to leave our property unsecured without fear of it being stolen, basic security measures must be followed, else you end up with your property stolen. This includes the easy pickings that were on offer for our resident criminals who have sticky fingers.

Police have also been advised of local residents that have been threatening vigilante action against persons suspected of committing property crimes in and around the Miles area. Whilst the frustration of having your property stolen and/or damaged is extremely high, please reconsider your actions. Too often members of communities have acted as vigilantes only to find themselves in hot water for things such as unlawful entry, deprivation of liberty, assault, etc. Please do not find yourself at the wrong end of the law by doing stupid things albeit for "good" reasons. There are reasons why police do what they do relating to all crimes, including property crimes; the law applies to them, too, and overly zealous police officers have found themselves in court and/or have been disciplined from within the QPS for actions that were, or might have been unlawful, given the context of events that had occurred.

Domestic violence and associated domestic violence continues to be a huge factor in the way police spend their working hours. Whilst it is frustrating for members of the community to hear that police spend an ever-increasing amount of time on DV investigations to the detriment of other activities that officers could undertake, community members are reminded that we are all part of a great societal shift; we are all part of changing the culture surrounding relationships in Queensland and in Australia. This change in culture promises to leave a legacy of respect withing relationships that will ultimately benefit our children's children in the long run.






















Back to the Bush Festival 2023





- Fertilise If you didn't manage to fertilise in September, now is the time. Be careful with this though and only fertilise if you can water it in well.
- Mulch Cover up your ground. This helps to retain moisture and also aides in preventing weeds which are loving this time of year.
- Pests and diseases Be vigilant as these are ramping up with spring. Check your plants regularly and treat as needed. Try to keep your plants strong and healthy to help resist disease.
- Prune or deadhead shrubs and spring flowering annuals and perennials. This will help to save nutrients and energy being put into areas where it is no longer required. Deadheading also helps to prolong flowering.

This is your last chance for a range of vegetables to be planted before summer hits. Consider using more heat tolerant varieties.



Mandarin Pork Stir-Fry



Makes 4 servings | 10min prep | 15min cook

Ingredients

- 2 cups uncooked instant rice
- 1 tablespoon cornstarch
- 1/2 teaspoon garlic powder
- 1/2 teaspoon ground ginger
- 1/2 cup orange juice
- 1/4 cup water
- 2 tablespoons soy sauce
- 1 pork tenderloin (1 pound), cut into 2-inch strips
- 2 tablespoons canola oil
- 1 package frozen sugar snap peas
- 1 can mandarin organes, drained

Method

- Cook rice according to package directions. Meanwhile, in a small bowl, combine the cornstarch, garlic powder and ginger. Stir in orange juice until smooth. Stir in water and soy sauce; set aside.
- In a large wok or skillet, stir-fry pork in oil until juices run clear; remove to a platter and keep warm. In the same skillet, stir-fry peas until tender. Return pork to skillet. Stir orange juice mixture; add to skillet. Cook and stir for 2 minutes or until thickened. Gently stir in oranges. Serve with rice.

- 1 tsp Coles Cinnamon Ground
- 125g butter, melted, cooled
- 2 eggs, whisked
- 3 ripe bananas, mashed

Method

- Preheat oven to 180°C. Grease and line the base and side of an 11 x 21cm x 6cm deep (base) loaf pan.
- Combine flours, sugar and cinnamon in a large bowl. Whisk butter and eggs together. Stir in banana. Spoon into prepared pan. Smooth the surface.
- Bake for 45-50 mins or until a skewer inserted into the centre comes out clean. Set aside in the pan for 10 mins before turning out onto a wire rack. Serve warm spread with butter.
